

	<b>Intervention</b>	<b>Accommodation</b>
<b>Definition</b>	<p>Targeted instruction based on student needs. Interventions are in addition to the general education curriculum.</p> <p>Strategies can become interventions if it includes step-by-step descriptions so it can be implemented consistently and replicated by other people.</p> <p>An intervention can be measured and tracked using data that can be graphed.</p>	<p>A change in the environment, curriculum format, or use of equipment that allow a student to gain access to content and complete tasks. Accommodations create an equal opportunity to demonstrate knowledge and skills.</p> <p>Accommodations are designed to provide equity and access and are not a separate method of instruction.</p> <p>Accommodations are not typically measured using graphable data.</p>
<b>Examples (non-exhaustive list)</b>	<p>Check-in/check out</p> <p>Behavior chart</p> <p>Teaching organizational strategies</p> <p>Specific, systematic skill instruction in reading or math</p>	<p>Seat near the teacher</p> <p>Small group testing</p> <p>Extended time for assignments and/or tests</p> <p>Provide with an extra set of textbooks at home</p> <p>for a more extensive list see Tier 1 Accommodations checklist on the FMS Weebly</p>
